Motion to Set Speaking Time	Yes	No	Simple majority	Raised to set or change the speaking time.
Motion to Open / Close the Speaker's List	Yes	No	Simple majority	Raised to add or stop adding countries to the list of speakers.
Motion to Adjourn Meeting	Yes	No	None	Raised to end the committee session for lunch, dinner or until the next meeting of the committee.
Motion to Extend to ___ More Points of Information	Yes	No	None	Raised to introduce more points of information to the speaker.
Motion to Table / Adjourn Clause	Yes	No	2/3 majority	Raised to stop debating a clause and moving it to the bottom of the list.
Motion to Divide the House	Yes	No	None	Raised to repeat the voting procedure without allowing abstentions.
Motion for a Roll-Call Vote	Yes	No	None	Raised to repeat the voting procedure by calling each country's name.
Motion to Move to Moderated Caucusing	Yes	No	Simple majority	Raised to move to moderated caucusing, delegates should specify the purpose for and the length of the moderated caucusing.

Motion for Lobbying Time/ Unmoderated Caucusing.	Yes	No	Simple majority	Raised to suspend debate
Motion to Extend ___ Time.	Yes	No	Simply majority	Raised to extend lobbying/ unmoderated caucusing/ moderated caucusing time.

Points	Second Required?	Interrupt Speaker	Vote to Pass	Notes
Point of Order	No	No	None	Raised to address an incorrect procedural move by the Chair. Does not allow the delegate to speak on the topic of debate.
Point of Inquiry	No	No	None	Raised when a delegate has question regarding the procedure of debate.
Point of Personal Privilege	No	Yes (Audibility Only)	None	Raised when a delegate experiences personal discomfort (i.e. unable to hear, too hot/cold etc.)
Point of Information	No	No	None	Raised to other delegates for asking questions related to speeches and draft resolution.
Yield	No	No	None	Made after a delegate speaks. Can only yield to questions or speaking for.
