List of Motions

Motion	Description	Seconds/ Objections	Votes Needed
Motion to Adjourn Meeting	Raised to end the committee session for lunch, dinner or until the next session of the committee.	Yes	Simple Majority
Motion to Close Debate	Raised when ending the last MUN session in the conference after voting on draft resolution.	Yes	Simple Majority
Motion to Extend More Points of Information	Raised to introduce more points of information to the speaker.	No	Chairs' Discretion
Motion to Table / Adjourn submission paper	Raised to stop debating a submission paper and moving it to the bottom of the list.	Yes	2/3 Majority
Motion to Divide the House	Raised to repeat the voting procedure without allowing abstentions. This motion can only be raised if initial voting fails to reach a conclusive vote on a submission paper or draft resolution.	No	Chairs' Discretion
Motion for a Roll-Call Vote	Raised to repeat the voting procedure by calling each country's name.	No	Chairs' Discretion
Motion to Move to Moderated Caucus: topic x, total speaking time of y, individual speaking time of z.	Raised to move to moderated caucusing. Delegates should specify the topic, total speaking time (the length of the moderated caucusing), and the individual speaking time per delegate.	Yes	Simple Majority
Motion for Lobbying Time/ Unmoderated Caucus, total time of x.	Raised to move to an Unmoderated Caucus. The speaker should specify total time (total length of the unmoderated caucus).	Yes	Simple Majority
Motion to Extend Unmoderated	Raised to extend lobbying/ unmoderated caucusing time.	Yes	Chairs' Discretion



Caucus			
Motion to move to clauses	Raised to move to clauses stage, where the committee discusses and votes on submission papers. Can only be raised with chairs' discretion.	Yes	Simple Majority
Motion to vote on draft resolution	Raised to move to voting on draft resolution. Can only be raised with chairs' discretion.	Yes	2/3 Majority
Motion to follow up	Raised by delegate to raise a follow-up question to their point of information. It can be raised once per point of information at most.	No	Chairs' Discretion

4. Motion to move to clauses
5. Motion for Lobbying Time/ Unmoderated Caucus.
6. Motion to Move to Moderated Caucus
7. Motion to Extend Unmoderated Caucus
8. Motion to Table / Adjourn submission paper
9. Motion to Extend More/ X More Points of Information
10. Motion to Divide the House
11. Motion for a Roll-Call Vote
12. Motion for a follow-up



Points

Point	Description	Disrupt Speaker?
Point of Information	<p>Questions for the speaker. Can only be entertained during General Speakers List and during clauses stage.</p> <p>A delegate may raise one point of information per speech, even if they raised a motion to extend points of information. However, they may be chosen to raise an additional point of information if there are no other delegates wishing to do so.</p>	No
Point of Order	A point of order is raised by delegates to address an incorrect procedural move by the chair.	No
Point of Inquiry	A point raised by delegates to ask about the rules of procedure or any matter pertaining to MUN and the conference. The chairs are to provide an answer.	No
Point of Personal Privilege	A point raised by delegates when they experience a personal discomfort and ask for the matter to be rectified. [the voice of the speaker is too low, the AC temperature is too high, etc].	Yes
